The History of Independent Arable Advice in the UK

- Paid independent arable advice in the UK started in the Late 1970s with the demise of state funding for the government arable advisory service
- AICC formed in 1981 as a professional body and drove recognition of independents
- The number of independent crop advisors rose dramatically in the 1980s and growth has continued over the last 33 years.

Crop walking/IPM

- Assessing fields for weeds, disease, and pests. Up to 30 km/day in spring
- Economic and environmental assessment of potential recommendation.
- Traps and baits set.

Independent Crop Consultants

- Legally compliant
